



#### Let us all "Walk with Jesus faithfully"

I took up the challenge of taking part in a 3-day Esther Fasting and Prayer in early December 2019. Though mine was not a perfect fast (I needed some sugared fluids, beyond just plain water, on the second night), I still completed the 3-day full fast. I have learnt through this fasting and prayer what it meant to "walk with God faithfully".

- 1) I learned to rely on God for strength to ward off temptations and handle tough encounters
- 2) I learned to keep my focus on Jesus. I drew closer to Jesus. I start to understand more on what intimate fellowship with God is all about.
- 3) I learned to be more aware of my sins and pride. I needed Jesus to forgive me. He reminded me that He is my Saviour & Lord again & again.

Thus, "Walking with God" faithfully is more than just a relationship. It is about discipleship, following Christ and obedience. If I have problems I pray and seek His wisdom to find solutions. It is thus important we "ALL TOGETHER" walk with God like Enoch, faithfully.

### Formation and Constitution of SCAC English District (ED) on 23 Nov 2019

# **Chronology**

2006: Pastoral survey on issues and challenges amongst SCAC English Ministry Churches. Some major issues identified were the weak link with District and SCAC levels due to the language barrier and programs not tailor-made to our needs.

2008: Formation of English Ministry Committee (EMC)

2010: Formation of English District (ED) was mooted by the then Bishop, Bishop Hwa Yung.

2015: "EMC Refocus"

- EMC task force was set up.
- Twenty resolutions endorsed by President Su, SCAC Executive Board and Annual Conference.
- Formation of ED is Resolution No.10

2017 Sept: English District Task Force formed to prepare for the formation of ED

2019 May: Formation of ED was presented to SCAC Executive Board. Majority gave their blessings.

June: Worked out the final implications, solutions, implementation and time-line.

4 Sept: EMC met and finalized the presentations and petition for joining ED in the respective coming Local Conferences, District Conferences and Annual Conference. SCAC Executive Board also endorsed the ED Formation date.

20 Nov: At the 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference, the formation of English District was approved. The English District Superintendent is Rev. Lenita Tiong.

23 Nov: The English District was constituted.

English-Speaking Churches / Preaching Centres included:

**Kuching** – Faith Methodist Church (FMC), Tabuan Trinity Methodist Church, Living Hope Methodist Preaching Centre

Sibu – Wesley Methodist Church (WMC), Permai Methodist Preaching Centre

Bintulu – Emmanuel Methodist Church

Miri – Grace Methodist Church and Agape Grace Methodist Church

Nyelong Park Methodist Church (NPMC) and Senadin Methodist Centre (SMPC) remain as English Congregation and they are currently on board as observers.

Total: 6 churches, 2 preaching centres and 2 churches with English service.

FMC and WMC started as English ministry Churches, and later added the Chinese service. FMC joins ED together with their Chinese congregation while WMC multiplied into two churches- WMC (Wesley Methodist Church for English congregation) and WCMC (Wesley Chinese Methodist Church for Chinese congregation)

NPMC and SMPC are Chinese Churches having English service. They will continue to be under their respective present District Conference but will join us as observers.

#### **District Commission of Ministries for 2020**

The initial formation of 7 District Commissions: District Commissions on Ministry, Laity, Christian Education, Worship & Music, Evangelism, Missions and Christian Social Concerns. The current pioneer office bearers and Commissioners for English District 2020 are:

**ED Office Bearers** – Dr. Wong Sung Ging, Dr. Simon Wong CK, Mary Tong, Janet Liu, Ps. Linberg Wong

Chairpersons of District Commissions – Dr. Wong Sung Ging (Lay Leader), Dr. Simon Wong CK (Associate Lay Leader) (Laity), Dr. Winnie Chan (Christian Education), Dato Dr. Yao Sik Chi (Evangelism), Chia Kah Pheng (Christian Social Concern), Aaron Hii (Mission), Lu Huong Ying (Worship & Music).

#### Summary:

We believe the English-speaking churches within the English District, headed by a District Superintendent will make better progress through the following:

- More effective channel of communication to the Executive Board and SCAC.
- Well focused ministries and services to the English-speaking congregations.
- Stronger bond among all English Local Conferences to enhance team empowerment and to facilitate mobilization and sharing of resources.

It's just the beginning. We are in uncharted waters but by God's will, we will grow and grow stronger. May we all continue to be and make disciples of Christ.

We welcome brothers and sisters to become volunteers in the various activities we organize for this group of students such as futsal competition and festive occasions to let the students feel welcomed.

# 13th Kuching Company The Boys' Brigade in Malaysia

Entering the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of its formation, it is time to reflect upon what had been done for its further improvement. Our BB membership stood at an uncertain figure from SMKTJ as the boys had no meeting in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of 2019 whereas, we had 13 Boys from BIS (Borneo International School). Nonetheless, the program and budget for 2020 was set and we have to move on.

Recruitment was conducted in January 2020. A total of 21 new boys were recruited with 6 from BIS and 15 from SMKTJ. The needs of BB boys from of these 2 schools are totally different. Therefore, alternative approaches are needed to carry out the program. For SMKTJ, BM has to be used with a little mix of English when communicating with them. Materials in BM are limited and we don't have enough officers who are able to communicate in BM.

We saw an increase in the membership when we have 46 boys and 78 officers as of February 2020 (Figure inclusive of year 1 members). This gave us greater encouragement to move forward with the posibility of forming our BB BAND as initially planned.

In His strength and guidance, I pray that God will uplift our officers with confidence and hope to advance His Kingdom. In a timely mannar, God has opened a new way for us to minister at SMKTJ where most of the students are from the rural areas of our state.




